



Next Steps

- Partners are currently committed to finalize the Transnational Job Placement Toolkit aimed to support JMC in effectively matching labour demand and supply in the ICT sector at European level. On one hand, the toolkit will allow job counsellors to identify the needs on the enterprises' side ("Business Needs Tool"); on the other hand, to assess jobseekers skills ("Skills Tool").
- At the same time, the consortium is working on the design of the "Mobility Welcome Service Handbook" which will serve as a guideline to install a MWS. It will define the service's structure, its objectives, the target groups and the methodology to use, based on the Action Workflow Analysis (AWA), a model aimed at creating a process of mutual commitment among actors to achieve cooperatively a goal in a network of relations.
- Last but not the least, partners will develop the "MWS Management Toolkit" providing tools to support the management of a Mobility Welcome Service and its transferability to different organizational contexts. It will contain both a manual for monitoring processes and guidelines to enhance the service performance.



Project overview

- **AMICO – an Alliance for Mobility InComing and Outgoing – is an Erasmus + funded project** approved in 2015 among the strategic partnerships for Higher Education. The main goal of the project is to facilitate labour mobility among European countries. AMICO will contribute to tackle the mismatch of qualifications in Europe improving the provision of service and producing practical tools in support of people willing to mobilise. Specifically, AMICO focuses on geographical mobility in the ICT sector, a field where the mismatch is increasingly rising, but all the products and tools produced by the consortium will be designed and implemented in order to easy to reply in each Member State and all activity sectors.

Products

- A specialised curriculum “Job Mobility Counsellor”, a specialisation course that provides knowledge and expertise on job counselling with a transnational dimension.
- A toolkit aimed at analysing the competences and mobility needs of enterprises, job seekers and young entrepreneurs in a transnational dimension.
- A Mobility Welcome Service (MWS), representing a guidance service and a physical point of contact between the mobility job counsellor and both job-seekers and employers interested in geographical labour mobility.



What has been already accomplished

The “Job Mobility Counsellor” curriculum has been designed and implemented and it is articulated in 4 modules and 2 laboratories:

Module 1: International Counselling and Placement.

Module 2: Customer Orientation.

Module 3: EU Intercultural Management.

Module 4: International Service Management.

Co-working Laboratory: Organising an International Counselling and Placement Service.

Virtual Mobility Laboratory: Building Networks.

A project that aims to facilitate intra-European labour mobility and to tackle demand/supply mismatch in the ICT sector at European level

Piloting activities took place in each partner country in order to test and validate the course. All the partners participated in implementing the different activities, which included face-to-face classrooms, Co-working Laboratories and Virtual Mobility Laboratories. Each country followed the structure of the course adopting different methodologies in accordance with the specific national context. GAP, as IO leader, had the task to harmonize all the different validations, and design the final version of the Toolkit for the Validation and Quality Assurance of the Curriculum, which is currently under the refining phase and incorporates the experiences acquired by the consortium creating a homogeneous route of Validation and Quality Assurance of the Curriculum.
