## A new Alliance for Mobility InComing and Outgoing

### GERMANY, Information Event on IT Mobility

On 09<sup>th</sup> June 2018 the second German multiplier event of the Erasmus+ project AMICO took place at the Meeting Center VOGELANG, Schleiden (North Rhine-Westphalia). Potential mobile and interested employees as well as representatives and managers from employers were invited to the Multiplier Event.

GAP GmbH provided this Multiplier event. Together with Lena Holder, who represented the HdBA as a German university the project results were presented. The results include a training for future Job Mobility Counsellors, a concept for Mobility Welcome Services, which contribute significantly to establish a positive welcome culture, and a two-part instrument for improving the match between mobile workers and employers.

The multiplier event started at 10.00 am. The participants came successively to the event and were welcomed and individually supervised by Claudia Falter (Founder gap gmbh), Carsten Gajdzis (staff gap gmbh) and Lena Holder (HdBA). The project and its products were presented in a short presentation and all upcoming questions were answered afterwards. The tools could be tested on the PC and questions could be answered individually. Jointly with the event and Speed Meeting was carried out.

## UK, AMICO FINAL EVENT

Rinova held the final event of the Amico project in the UK on Friday 3 August at the Karamel Club in London. The event promotion was targeted at creative media entrepreneurs and mobility counsellors. Over 30 people attended, a large proportion of whom were young start up media creatives interested in mobility opportunities. The audience also included established creative media companies, freelancers and mobility advisers. Rinova presented the Amico Mobility Service and the results of the Amico project and collected feedback from audience members who had participated in the programme. The event also included Transnational Mobility Speed Meetings via Appear Here connecting with employers in Italy, Germany and Spain. Finally, there was a detailed explanation of how the mobility service operates for young entrepreneurs, and a presentation by a participant who had undertaken a successful six month exchange with a Host company. The meeting ended with an opportunity for questions, refreshments and networking.



## ITALY, ERIFO

On June 21<sup>st</sup> 2018 ERIFO hosted in its premises the Third Multiplier Event of the AMICO project. The event aimed at promoting the main results of the project and at encouraging the transnational mobility of workers in Europe as a solution to tackle the mismatch of the ICT competences at European level.

The speakers Ernesto Russo from CESFOR, Marco Vitiello from the La Sapienza University of Rome (partner of the project), Giovanna D'Alessandro, president of ERIFO, introduced the attendants to the AMICO project activities such as the MWS - Mobility Welcome Service opened at ERIFO. The speakers also talked about the relevance of the Mobility Chart as a tool to enhance job mobility and better matching of ICT skills at European level.

The final part of the event was dedicated to the emerging job profiles in the current European labour market. The focus was centred on the ICT sector which is strongly affected by skills mismatch. The Q&A and discussion time that followed converged upon how the ICT field can therefore benefit from job mobility by matching the skills demand and supply across Europe.

More than 30 people took part to the event. The highly participated final debate confirmed the general interest of the attendants regarding the themes addressed.

## SPAIN, THE MOBILITY WELCOME SERVICE IN DEPTH

DOCUMENTA, in collaboration with CITIC, carried out a multiplier event on July 17th at the premises of CITIC in Málaga.

The event gathered a diverse group of attendants namely young entrepreneurs of TIC sector, students, representative of employment services, VET centres and public and private universities, all interested in mobility opportunities.

Nuria García (CITIC) introduced the session and, after that, Amparo Coterillo (DOCUMENTA) presented shortly the Amico project and its outputs. The WMS and its methodology was explained in depth and then started a vivid debate on how to adapt and apply WMS to the different organisations attending the event.

Participants were very involve in the session and from the discussion arose interesting issues for further development of AMICO.
